






OUR MISSION:



HOW WE HELP

CLIENT STORY

"Ana" came to the U.S. when she was a child. She attended school, excelling in her classes, and married her high school sweetheart, who she also had children with. Ana's husband changed dramatically soon after they were married. He started physically abusing her and she worried he would also hurt her children, so she came to GLS for help. Our family law unit provided advice on her divorce and our immigration team worked with her on a VAWA self-petition and green card. They were with her every step of the way, from getting her driver's license to getting a job.

Eventually, Ana moved away from her husband and settled in a new area. She continued to be very proactive, emailing her attorney with updates and questions about what she needed to do to help her case be successful. After three years of waiting, her VAWA self-petition and green card were approved. Ana was free to move on with her life without fear of abuse, violence, or being separated from her children.

EMERGING ISSUES

EVICTION PREVENTION AND EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE:

The pandemic exacerbated the housing crisis. In December of 2020, credit rating agency Moody's estimated that 12 million renters would owe an average of \$5,850 in rent and utilities as a result of unemployment and lost income. The Aspen Institute estimated that 30-40 million Americans (roughly 1 in 10) could face eviction, partially caused by a lapse in federal benefits. Eviction prevention legal services combined with Emergency Rental Assistance quickly became one of the most important services for community members to avoid homelessness.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE:

In 2020, more than 2,000 people were killed in domestic-violence-related shootings in the U.S. Women who are preparing to leave their abusive partners are in the most danger, as either threats of separation by the partner or actual separations are most often the precipitating events that lead to murder. GLS continued to see alarming rises in cases requesting assistance addressing domestic violence.

"We are seeing more clients leaving their abusive partners because they have been able to use stimulus relief and housing protections to escape domestic violence. Previously, many of these same clients were in a situation of being trapped – be it by pandemic concerns or the patterns of economic abuse that hold so many victims captive."







FINANCIALS HOW WE ALLOCATE RESOURCES
