LETTER FROM THE CEO

For over 45 years, Gulfcoast Legal Services (GLS) has proudly provided critical legal aid in the Greater Tampa Bay Area. The 2023-2024 fiscal year was a period of significant growth, allowing us to expand our reach through new and continued partnerships with organizations such as Funding Florida Legal Aid, the Area Agency on Aging for Southwest Florida, the Juvenile Welfare Board, Stetson University College of Law, and many more valued supporters.

We launched our Pro Bono Unit, fully dedicated to recruiting and supporting volunteer attorneys looking to join us in our mission of providing superior legal services to those who otherwise could not afford counsel. Additionally, we expanded our legal aid services to older adults in southwest Florida, including Desoto, Charlotte, and Lee Counties. To support this growth, we successfully staffed and retained 13 new team positions, increasing our capacity to serve those in need.



Throughout 2023-2024, GLS recorded the highest number of hours spent in court to date, underscoring both the demand for legal services and the dedication of our staff to We faced serving the community. unprecedented challenges, as Hurricanes devastated Milton Helene and our communities. Though our offices were closed in the temporarily immediate aftermath of the disasters. GLS team members, several of whom experienced disaster impacts of their own, remained steadfast in our mission, volunteering to show up to outreaches and community meetings to ensure that community members were advised of their rights and had access to services.

As we move into 2024-2025 and beyond, we will continue to show up for our community. GLS remains committed to advancing justice and ensuring access to legal services for all. Join us as we continue expanding access to justice to our neighbors.


ABOUT US









RESTORING STABILITY AFTER THE STORM

Lynn, a mother of three young children turned to Gulfcoast Legal Services (GLS) for help after her former landlord refused to refund her security deposit. Following the devastation caused by Hurricane Ian, the property she was renting sustained severe damage. The landlord, unwilling to make necessary repairs, agreed to terminate the lease early and return her deposit.

However, after she vacated the property, the landlord refused to return the deposit, citing unreasonable and unconscionable lease terms as justification. Despite her repeated requests, the landlord staked an unfair claim to the funds. A GLS attorney stepped in to represent her in small claims court.

Through determined advocacy, GLS successfully negotiated the return of \$1,000 from the security deposit, helping the client recover much-needed financial stability during a challenging time.



STANDING UP AGAINST AN UNLAWFUL EVICTION



John, a hardworking tenant, sought help from Gulfcoast Legal Services after being served with an eviction complaint. His landlord had attempted to terminate his month-to-month tenancy but failed to provide the legally required notice. Recognizing the unfairness of the situation, Gulfcoast Legal Services stepped in to assist John. Our team helped him respond to the complaint and assert his legal defenses. As a result, the landlord's attorney voluntarily dismissed the eviction case.

To date, the landlord has not issued a new notice or filed any further eviction actions. With the support of GLS, John was able to protect his housing rights and maintain stability in his life.

A NEW BEGINNING THROUGH LEGAL SUPPORT

Isabella, a Pinellas County resident, turned to Gulfcoast Legal Services (GLS) after escaping an abusive marriage marked by physical, emotional, verbal, and sexual violence. With her husband's arrest, GLS's Family Law unit helped her secure a divorce, ensuring safety for her and her three children.

However, Isabella faced another challenge—her immigration status. Her U.S. citizen husband had never filed the necessary paperwork, leaving her future uncertain. GLS's Immigration unit stepped in, successfully helping her obtain legal permanent residency so she could remain in the U.S. with her children.

Later, Isabella encountered work authorization issues that prevented her from receiving crucial tax benefits. The GLS Financial Stability team assisted her in obtaining an SSN and work authorization, then successfully fought for her denied tax refund. A Tax Court Petition secured the full refund, plus \$1,271.34 in interest—totaling \$16,113.34. Through GLS's collaborative efforts, Isabella also qualified for \$8,541 in tax credits, providing her family with much-needed financial stability and a fresh start.




LEGAL ADVOCACY IN ACTION




Ms. Johnson, a low-income senior, came to GLS after a judgment creditor improperly garnished \$16,598.84 from her bank account. The funds seized were proceeds from her late husband's life insurance policy, in which she was the named beneficiary.

Under Florida law, life insurance proceeds are exempt from creditor garnishment. A GLS attorney took swift action to advise Ms. Johnson of her rights and assisted her in filing a Claim of Exemption. As a result, the full amount was promptly returned to her.
